A school text with leaded lines and wide margins. This edition was reprinted several times in Leipzig, the students of the University no doubt providing a stable local market.

The words ‘Hec werdea’ on the title page probably stand for ‘Haec Werdea scripsit’. Johannes Faber de Werdea seems to have been a local poet who contributed verses for title pages and dedications.
