Set from the first edition with Badius’s and Mancinellus’s commentaries, Lyon, 1498 (Juv052), with a new preliminary letter to Henri Valuphin. The word ‘rurfus’ in the colophon probably implies that this is the second edition supervised by Badius rather than that there was an earlier edition from his Parisian press. That the colophon is dated from Easter is shown by the date in the letter: 1506 ‘ad calculum Romanum’. In the letter Badius writes ‘Contraxi hiſce diebus commentariolos noſtros ... ut habiliores eſſent in minores ſed non minus exultas ac veridicas formas’. This must refer to the octavo edition which he had printed six days earlier (Juv066).

This present edition with the full commentary may well have been produced ſpecially for the Flemiſh market. Renouard ſtates that the three booksellers Meganc, Waterloose and Horenweghe have no known Parisian connections at this date, though Waterloose was later in aſſociation with Berthold Rembold between 1509 and 1512 (Renouard, 1956, p. 434). Badius did in fact occaſionally produce editions for foreign booksellers; cf. a Terence in 1504 for Wynkyn de Worde in London (*Imprimeurs pariſiens*, ii, no. 29; Lawton, 1926, no. 116); in 1511 Badius printed books for two booksellers in Ghent (*Imprimeurs pariſiens*, ii, nos. 165, 166). It is of intereſt that Badius did not take this opportunity to ſupply the three Greek paſſages in the text of Juvenal. They are ſtill printed in transliterated form although Badius had had Greek type ever ſince ſtarting his buſineſs in Paris in 1503 (*Imprimeurs pariſiens*, ii, p. 17).
