The preliminary letter has been replaced by a piece supposed to be spoken by Juvenal who has come up from the underworld to thank the printer for his care (*incipit* 'Miraris fortasse lector candidissime, cum me tam laetum, hylarem, praeque gaudio fere psallentem uideas, ...').
