Based on Trot’s Aldine imitation (Juv090). The material by Britannicus and Politian is probably taken from one of the 1514 Milanese Juvenals (Juv088 and Juv089). Mancinellus’s *Argumenta* may have been taken from one of the Lyonese editions containing his commentary, or from one of the editions by Quentell or from one of Badius’s octavo editions. There is no additional matter for the Persius.

Trot issued a close reprint in the following year (Juv110A).
