This edition has four fewer leaves than the Colines edition of 1528 (Juv112). Although the number of leaves and the contents seem to be the same as those of the 1529 Antwerp edition (Juv116), it is probable that Colines was resetting from a copy of his own earlier edition with the same intention of fitting the book into exactly eight sheets. Colines also published a Persius with Curio’s notes in 1535 (and a Horace in 1533).
