The second edition of Juvenal with the Estienne imprint

Textually one of the most important sixteenth-century editions of Juvenal, based on
Pithou's manuscript now at Montpellier which is given the *siglum* P in the *apparatus
critici* of modern editions. It is referred to by the siglum L in the *Variae lectiones* of this
edition. This edition contains the text of the ancient *scholia*.

The Gent UL copy, has a fly-leaf inscription of gift from Patisson to Florent Chrétien: 'Q
Sep. Florentis Christiani. | Dono Mamerti Patissonij Typographj | Regij'. The Bodleian copy
has a faint inscription on title page: 'Ex dono D. Patissonii'.
